# UK Activity

## ◆ Activity by HSE (Inspectorate)

- Hospital prosecuted and fined following a needlestick injury to a healthcare worker during venepuncture
- A programme of proactive inspection visits looking at prevention and management of sharps injuries and occupational dermatitis

# Worcestershire hospital trust fined after injury



Friday, 8 October 2010

A hospital trust has been forced to pay more than £20,000 in fines and costs after a healthcare worker contracted Hepatitis C after injuring herself on a needle used to take blood from an infected patient.




Worcestershire Acute Hospitals NHS Trust was fined £12,500 and ordered to pay £9,000 costs after pleading guilty to breaching the Health and Safety at Work Act and the Control of Substances Hazardous to Health Regulations.

## ◆ Data from NHS Supplies

- 50% of sales of IV cannula are safety cannula
- Purchasing decisions driven by national ‘patient safety’ alerts
